Este nexo condicional no ha salido hasta ahora, al menos, en los libros que usamos en la UNI.

Unless se traduce en español por **a menos que**.

Unless podemos decir que es lo mismo que **If ... not**.

O lo que es lo mismo, podemos decir que

If + negative = Unless + affirmative

*You'll never understand English **if you don't study** the grammar carefully. =
You'll never understand English **unless you study** the grammar carefully.*

***If she doesn't stop** eating, she will be sick. =
Unless she stops eating, she will be sick.*

*I wouldn't eat that **if I wasn't** very hungry. =
I wouldn't eat that **unless I was** very hungry.*
